 Congratulations to all Alabama chapters for fielding 51 Teams, which is more than double last year's 23 teams! That includes: 21 Open, 22 All-Services, and eight Middle School teams. a) In regional competition, teams are classified by their first round scores into three levels of technical ability. Platinum is the most technically competent category, then gold, followed by silver. Only Platinum teams compete in the national competition. All category teams compete in State and Regional competitions.

 Huntsville's Grissom High 'Team CyberSloths' in the Open Division and Huntsville's New Century Technology High School (NCTS) 'Team Alpha' in the All Service Division-Army JROTC. In the Open High School Division:

executed a pilot AFA CyberCamp Program in the summer of 2014. The camps emphasize fun, hands-on learning of cybersecurity principles that are relevant and applicable to everyday life.
